Transfer Articulation Agreement between MARIA COLLEGE and SCHENECTADY COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE

This agreement establishes procedures to promote the successful transition of qualified transfer students from Schenectady County Community College to the Psychology program at Maria College.

Objectives of the Agreement

- 1. To attract qualified students to Schenectady County Community College and Maria College.
- 2. To facilitate the effective transition of qualified students holding an Associate of Arts degree in Liberal Arts: Humanities and Social Sciences with a concentration in Psychology from Schenectady County Community College to the Bachelor of Science degree in Psychology at Maria College.
- 3. To foster continuous communication between the respective departments to provide accurate and timely advisement for interested students.

Terms of the Agreement

- 1. Students from Schenectady County Community College (SCCC) who complete the Associate in Arts degree in Liberal Arts: Humanities and Social Sciences with a concentration in Psychology and the courses outlined in the Addendum, with a minimum 2.5 cumulative grade point average, will be guaranteed admission into the Bachelor of Science degree program in Psychology at Maria College with full junior (third year) status.
- 2. An individual transfer credit evaluation will be provided by Maria College to ensure the SCCC graduate has met the requirements as listed in the Addendum.
- 3. Courses with grades of C or better will be accepted for transfer credit. Courses with grades of C- or D+ may be accepted for elective credit only.
- 4. Transfer students must complete and file the Maria College application.
- 5. Students who do not meet the requirements of this agreement may also be considered for admission and will be evaluated on an individual basis.

Review and Revision of the Agreement

1. This agreement is valid for two years from the date signed, at which time it should be reviewed for possible renewal.

2. This joint agreement will be reviewed when substantial changes are made in the curriculum on either campus. At the request of either party, a review of the Transfer Articulation Agreement will be conducted by both institutions.

Termination

This agreement shall remain in effect from the date on which it is signed until such time as either institution elects to terminate it. Termination by either institution will be announced with sufficient anticipation to assure that any students enrolled will have the opportunity to be admitted to Maria College under its terms.
